
WINCHESTER COVID-19 ASSESSMENT CENTRE

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Where is the Assessment Centre?

- The Assessment Centre is in the Lions Club hall at 515 Albert Street. Parking is at the back of the hall.
- There is signage to provide instructions for patients.

When is it open?

- It is open from 12 to 6 pm from Monday to Friday. Patients are advised to use physical distancing at the Assessment Centre.

How do I access the Assessment Centre?

- Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms (such as fever and worsening cough), is first encouraged to go to the Ministry of Health's website and [complete a self-assessment online](#) and follow the recommendations.
- You can also contact your primary care provider or call Telehealth Ontario at 1-866-797-0000. People with moderate, worsening (but non-severe) symptoms may be referred to the Assessment Centre. The decision to test will be based on Ministry of Health guidelines.
- Anyone experiencing severe symptoms such as difficulty breathing should call 911 or go to the hospital emergency room.

What happens at the Assessment Centre?

- As a patient coming to the Assessment Centre, you will have to sanitize your hands and put on a mask. You will be screened, tested (if deemed appropriate) and provided with further directions. These directions may be to go home with no further action required, or to go home and self-isolate while awaiting the test result. If deemed necessary, you may also be sent to the WDMH Emergency Department for further assessment.
- Please bring your health card or one piece of identification.
- The EOHU will follow-up with patients who are tested for COVID-19.
- Patients should come alone unless they require support or an interpreter.

Can I come to the Assessment Centre for other health issues?

- The Assessment Centre is not a walk-in clinic and cannot provide "doctor sick notes".
